REMINDER ABOUT HEALTH INSURANCE CARDS

At the beginning of each new year, parents often receive new health insurance cards. FOC receives a lot of calls from parents needing new cards because the other parent has not provided them or communicated a change. If you have a child support case and are ordered to provide health insurance for your child, please remember to provide updated insurance information to the other parent.

Every time your insurance changes, your court order requires that you keep the other parent and the FOC informed. When a change occurs, please provide a new insurance card to the other parent and a copy of your new insurance card (front and back) to the FOC. Feel free to email or call us with any questions.
