- 1. Meeting called to Order by Mary Johnson at 0900.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance
- 3. Guest Speaker Kathleen Alsobrooks shared information about the campaign from January 2023-July 2023 for Kent County Veterans Services. To date, the campaign has delivered 669,000 impressions, reached 123,000 people, and received 630 clicks.
- 4. Voting on public comment to suspend the rules for Paul from West Michigan Veterans Coalition to be able to speak about the Healthcare Symposium. All were in favor.
- 5. Approval of minutes
 - a. Martha: There was an error in the cost of training the dogs. The numbers are actually between 4,000 and 8,000 dollars.
 - b. Motion to accept minutes. Motion accepted by Mel Bauman. All were in favor.
- 6. Success Stories
 - a. Ryan: One of the surveys received by Kent County Veterans Services pertained to Brad, one of the Veteran Service Officers. The survey stated that, "This looks like the place to be" and that he'll "get more done here than anywhere else".
 - b. Martha: Went to a commemoration for a Vietnam veteran that died while in Vietnam and some people came up to Martha and said that Kent County Veterans Services is a great place to get help.
 - c. Martha: Another success story is that Ryan has been working really hard on creating an Excel program for our data collection. Now a comprehensive report can be given on each of the programs for KCVS each month.
- 7. Monthly Impact Report Ryan Grams

- a. Record Requests: Down from June 2023
- b. Fully-developed claims: Slightly lower than June of 2023
- c. Face-to-face contacts have increased
- d. Intent to file: We are on track
- e. Claims in Development: 264 with 22 awarded
- f. Monthly award of dollars has significantly increased
- g. Burials: Four which is up from June
- h. Meijer Vouchers: 1 for the month but we have 214 for the year to date.

They are trying to get the house back to being able to sell it. No one can live in the house right now. The Guardsman is deployed right now. Kenyon was looking for resources for the family as well.
 - iii. Martha was going to get in contact with Reggie and Kenyon about this family and get more information so the committee can vote on what to do for the family.

 - i. Tuesday: double graduation from treatment court
 - ii. Kent County is the only county in the state that has had and serves females.
 - iii. Covid has caused issues for the criminal justice field and we are basically working with a clean slate and it is taking a few weeks to recognize veterans in the jail and by then, they have already taken a plea deal.
 - iv. Waiting on the final descriptive report from the evaluators.
 - v. Our recidivism rate is at 8 or 9 percent compared to the rest of the state which is at twenty percent or more.
