Work with treating physicians to provide and interpret clinical guidelines

Establish a registry of exposed individuals and perform a health survey on all exposed individuals



### **POTENTIAL** Health Effects include:

Thyroid dysfunction

High cholesterol

Ulcerative colitis

Pregnancy induced hypertension

Testicular cancer Kidney cancer Elevated liver enzymes\* High uric acid\*

#### \*not linked in C8 study



# Uncertainty with PFAS Exposure

"Although the evidence is not conclusive, your health problem could be associated with exposure to PFAS....[However], there is no way to know if PFAS exposure has caused your health problem or made it worse."

# Medical Evaluation with PFAS exposure

- Should be individualized with your physician
  - Consultation available with Kent County Health Department
  - Consultation available with Spectrum Health Toxicology Clinic

- PFAS blood testing
  - Not routinely recommended
- Other laboratory testing
  - Also not routinely recommended, but will depend on your personal health history
